Health

Q. Any news on how soon testing in the County will be carried out?

The UK does not have the resources of equipment or staff to do mass testing at the moment, although the Government is trying to increase its capacity.

Gloucestershire Hospitals Trust's labs have been testing swabs for some time. The national testing strategy remains as follows:

The capacity for testing is limited however PHE are leading a programme to rapidly increase testing capability. Therefore the current testing provision focuses on testing of the most vulnerable people (the sickest patients in ICU and in hospital, testing to support management of outbreaks in care homes and other settings and then, if there is surplus capacity, the testing of key staff by exception).

Q. Is the county council supplying facemasks to members of the public for use in supermarkets for example?

Washing hands and social distancing are more effective at keeping members of the public protected for limited "contact" settings like supermarkets. Supplies of PPE need to be prioritised for key workers performing procedures that require closer or prolonged contact.

Facemasks don't offer any real protection for members of the public.

Q. There has been a sharp increase in domestic violence. Is the county council working with GDASS and the Beresford Group and others to find ways of sheltering people who are coming forward because of domestic abuse/violence; could hotels, b & b's being used as accommodation for them?

Figures do not currently show a sharp increase, but it is expected to rise.

The county council commission the Glos Domestic Abuse Support Service and has been working closely with them. GDASS has arrangements in place to work remotely and remain in contact with their clients and the other support services they work with. GDASS has proactively sending out a weekly newsletter to a wide range of professionals reminding them to consider domestic abuse at this time and when in contact with service users or members of the public. This will include Stroud Beresford as the provider of the local refuge.

The sector nationally is very aware of the likely impact of COVID-19 on increasing

the risk of domestic abuse in many households. More information is available on the [gov.uk website](#).
