Hardwicke Housing Need Survey – Executive Summary

Hardwicke Parish Council recently commissioned Gloucestershire Rural Community Council to undertake a Housing Need Survey in order to ascertain the affordable housing needs within the Parish. Housing Need Surveys were sent to 2263 households and 239 (11%) replies were returned to GRCC. Analysis of the data revealed that:

- 92% of respondents owned their own home, 4% rented from Stroud District Council or a Housing Association and 3% were in private rented housing.
- 5 respondents revealed that a member of their family had moved away in the last 5 years because they could not afford the accommodation available within the parish.
- 67 respondents from within the parish said they would like to move house within the next 5 years
- Of these 67, 7 households have self-identified themselves as being in need of affordable housing, 5 of which require affordable rented accommodation whilst 2 would prefer shared ownership.
- The other 60 respondents had sufficient funds to meet their needs on the open market and their reasons for moving included:
 - old age/retirement 17 people (26%)
 - larger home 21 people (32%)
 - independence -10 people (15%)
 - avoid development/more rural setting 8 people (12%)
 - closer to work 2 people (3%)
 - cheaper home 2 people (3%)
- 26% of respondents were in favour of a small development of affordable homes, 34% were against and 32% were unsure.

What happens next? A copy of the final report has been passed to Stroud District Council. Hardwicke Parish Council is currently considering its options on how it will respond to the survey findings.
